

AP 3516 REGISTERED SEX OFFENDER INFORMATION

The District shall include in its Annual Security Report a statement advising the campus community where information pertaining to registered sex offenders may be obtained.

Sex offenders are required to register with the police in the jurisdiction in which they resideSex offenders who are employees or volunteers in the District must disclose their status as registrants upon application as well as submit fingerprints prior to acceptance of the position if they would be working directly and in an:

- unaccompanied setting with minor children on more than an incidental and occasional basis or have supervision or disciplinary power over minor children or
- accompanied setting with minor children and their work would require touching minor children on more than an incidental basis.

A sex offender who must register for committing a crime against a minor victim under the age of 16 is prohibited from serving as an employer, employee, contractor, or volunteer in any capacity in which the sex offender would be working directly and in an unaccompanied setting with minor children on more than an incidental and occasional basis or involving having supervision or disciplinary power over minor children.

Sex offenders who may be required to register should do so at the Santa Barbara Police Department.
